### Directions

- Authors use vivid details to help readers draw pictures in their mind as they read. Choose a passage (from one of the short stories that we have read in class) that has several very vivid, descriptive details.
- On 8.5 x 11 inch paper, draw a visual image that depicts the scene exactly as it is described in the text. If there aren't several vivid details, then it is not a good passage to select for this activity.
- Fill the entire page, so that there is very little open space.
- Include the quote on the paper, on the same side of the paper as the visualization.
- Be sure to use quotation marks when you copy someone else's text onto your own paper.
- Include the title of the story and the author.
- Take your time on the drawing and writing, making sure that there are no grammatical or mechanical errors.
- Effort and neatness are especially important.
- Be prepared to read your quote to the class and discuss your drawing.
